Setting the scene: Historical context, key features, milestones



- Growing number of young people and marginalized communities and severe risks of social exclusion
- Risk of increase of xenophobia, racism, and violence
- Limited impact of traditional shortterm approaches





Working with municipalities on designing more youthsupportive policies


